Taming the Butterflies

Research shows that public speaking scares many people. If you're one of them, or if you just feel nervous, you could use the technique of visualization.

This may work better the more you know about the situation for your presentation—and it's definitely more effective when you prepare well.

Imagine yourself beginning with confidence, making a great first impression, establishing a rapport with the participants.

Imagine your preparation paying off as you move through your presentation with poise, ready for anything. Choose positive, successful images of yourself and you'll feel less nervous.
